GRENSVILLE COMMUNITY PROFILE

GREENSVILLE COUNTY

consists of 300 square miles located on the banks of the Meherrin River in Southside Virginia just north of the North Carolina state line. The community is directly connected to the entire Eastern Seaboard by interstate highways and rail service. Richmond, the state capital, is 65 miles to the north; the port of Norfolk is 80 miles east; and Raleigh, North Carolina is 95 miles southwest.

Government

Greensville County has a County Administrator and a four-member Board of Supervisors; the county has a comprehensive plan and zoning and subdivision ordinances.

Emporia serves as the county seat. Jarratt is the only incorporated town within the county.

Taxes

Localities in Virginia collect a 1% sales tax and do not tax other items taxed at the State level. Counties and cities in Virginia are separate taxing entities.

Therefore, a company pays taxes either to a county or to a city. If a company is located in a town, it pays town and county taxes except for utility taxes which are paid only to the town and the license tax which is paid only to the town unless town law permits the additional collection of a county tax.

Manufacturers pay real estate, machinery and tools, truck and automobile utility, and sales taxes. Nonmanufacturers pay real estate, tangible personal property, truck and automobile, utility, and sales taxes. They also may pay either a merchants' capital or a license tax.

Community Facilities

Southern Virginia Regional Medical Center (SVRMC) opened its doors on December 18, 2003 replacing the aging Greensville Memorial Hospital. The 80 bed acute care medical center provides for the healthcare needs of more than 50,000 residents in Emporia/Greensville and the surrounding communities. Containing over 136,000 square feet, the facility is situated on 18.6 acres of land, conveniently located near Interstate 95, Hwy 58 and Hwy 301.

Emporia Manor is a 120 bed nursing facility specializing in long term care. Greensville Manor is a 65 bed nursing facility specializing in short term rehabilitation. Eugene H. Bloom Retirement Center is a 65 bed assisted living facility.

The William E. Richardson Memorial Library and a bookmobile serve the community. Emporia is a Virginia Main Street Community, and the downtown commercial district has a number of specialty shops near the river; additional trade areas are near the interchanges of Interstate 95.

Approximately 55 churches are located in the community representing most leading Protestant denominations and the Roman Catholic faith. A Jewish synagogue is located in Petersburg.

Lifestyle

The Meherrin River Arts Council, the Greensville -Emporia Cultural Arts Association, Southern Virginia Dance Council, and Emporia's Arts in Public Places sponsor performances and programs.

A day at the beach is easy when you live in Emporia, because Virginia Beach is a drive of less than 2 hours.

Greensville County is home of the East Coast's largest bicycling event, the Great Peanut Ride. Agribusiness events include the Brink Horse Show and the 4-H Livestock Show and Sale. Among the most notable community festivals are the Virginia Pork Festival and the Virginia Peanut Festival.
